LEAVES... The Village crew has begun to pick up loose leaves from the curbside and will continue to do so until Friday, November 19th, weather permitting. **The last day to place your loose leaves at the curb is Thursday November 18th**, after that all leaves will have to be bagged for pick up. Please remember to rake them near the curb, still on the grass, not in the road where they can block the flow of water drainage. **THERE WILL BE NO BRUSH PICK UP AFTER NOV. 18TH NO BAGGED LEAF PICK UP AFTER NOV. 29TH UNTIL RESUMING ON APRIL 1ST.**
